## EARLY BIRD REGISTRATION EXTENDED FOR CODES CONFERENCE IN OMAHA Experts to Focus on How Energy Codes Can Be Effective, Beneficial

LINCOLN – The Nebraska Energy Office announced that the **Early Bird Registration of \$130 for the Great Plains Energy Codes Conference will be extended until Friday, September 14, 2012.** The regional conference being held October 16-18, 2012 in Omaha at the Marriott in Regency Plaza, will present innovative ways of addressing enforcement and compliance of energy codes. Additional sessions will present information on the values of codes, how to adopt and implement codes and grassroots advocacy.

The conference is designed for interested professionals from Nebraska, Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota, Wyoming, Colorado, Kansas and Missouri. Those professionals who work with building energy codes such as homebuilders, architects, engineers, general contractors, heating/cooling and ventilation professionals, utility representatives, local codes officials, policy makers, government officials and equipment suppliers will find the topics beneficial.
