

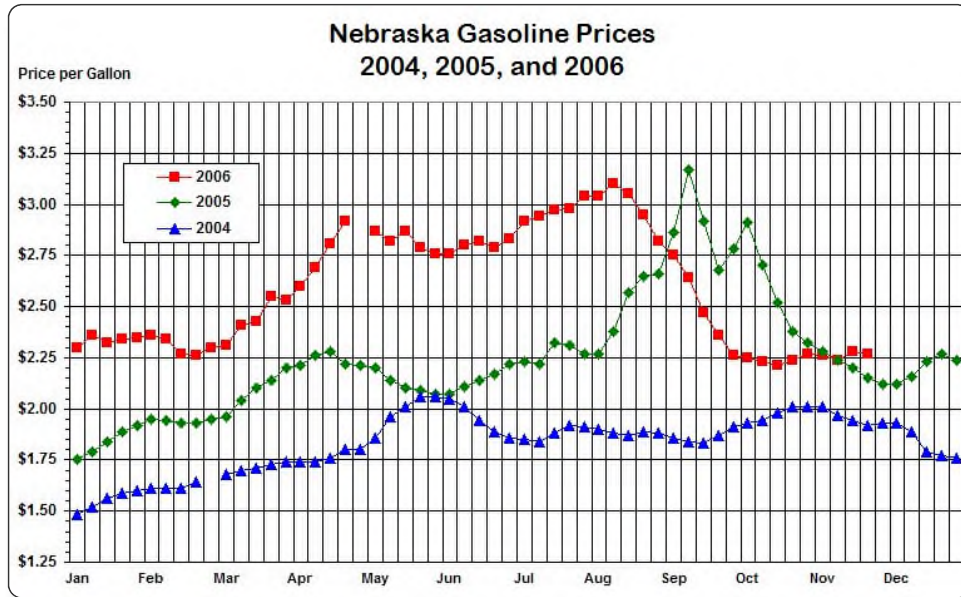
Nebraska Gasoline and Diesel Prices

For the week of November 20, Nebraska's average gasoline price decreased one cent per gallon from the previous week to \$2.27, which was 12 cents higher than the price at this time last year. This week, average prices in surveyed cities ranged from \$2.18 in Columbus to \$2.32 in North Platte. As of November 17, the Midwest gasoline stock level was just below the normal range with 49.6 million barrels.

Nebraska's average diesel price had risen two cents to \$2.67 per gallon. According to the [weekly price report](#), this week's state average was 16 cents higher than the price at this time last year. Weekly averages in the surveyed cities ranged from \$2.55 in Norfolk to \$2.72 in Kearney. On the supply side, the Midwest distillate fuel inventory level was below the normal range with 20.8 million barrels of diesel fuel as of November 17.

Regular unleaded gasoline is regular unleaded motor gasoline with an 87 to 88 octane. Diesel fuel is fuel used for internal combustion in diesel engines.

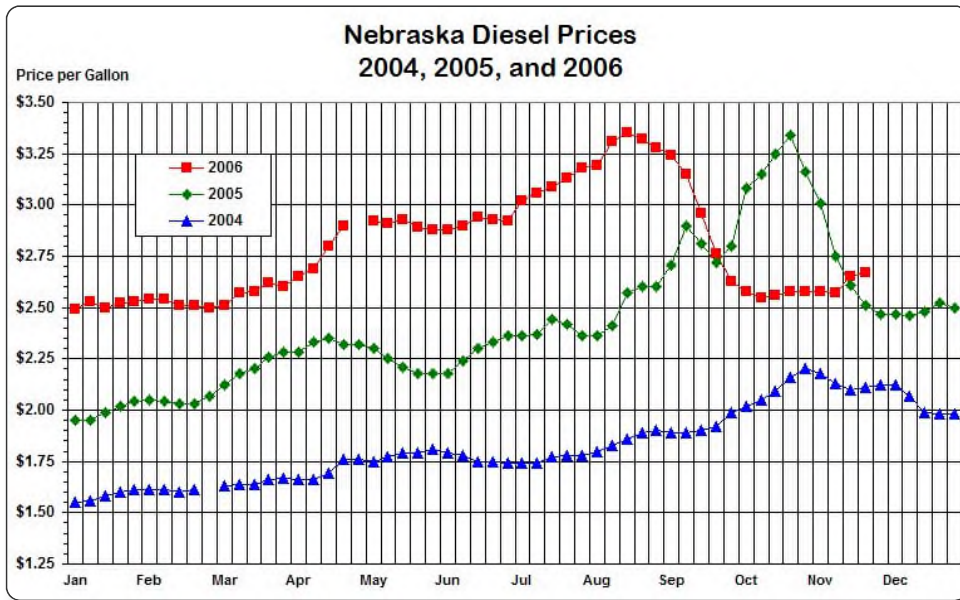
