

## Nebraska Gasoline and Diesel Prices

### Motor Gasoline

For the week of February 8, Nebraska's average gasoline price had fallen one cent from the last report to \$2.65, which was 71 cents higher than the price at this time last year. Weekly averages in the surveyed cities ranged from \$2.60 in Grand Island and Omaha to \$2.71 in Kearney. As of February 5, the Midwest gasoline stock level was at the upper boundary of the normal range with 56.7 million barrels.

### Diesel Fuel

The average price of diesel fuel in the state had decreased three cents from the last report to \$2.78. According to the [weekly price report](#), this week's state average was 54 cents higher than the price at this time last year. Weekly averages in the surveyed cities ranged from \$2.71 in North Platte to \$2.84 in Norfolk. On the supply side, the Midwest distillate fuel inventory level was at the upper boundary of the normal range with 28.7 million barrels of ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel and 2.3 million barrels of low sulfur diesel fuel as of February 5.

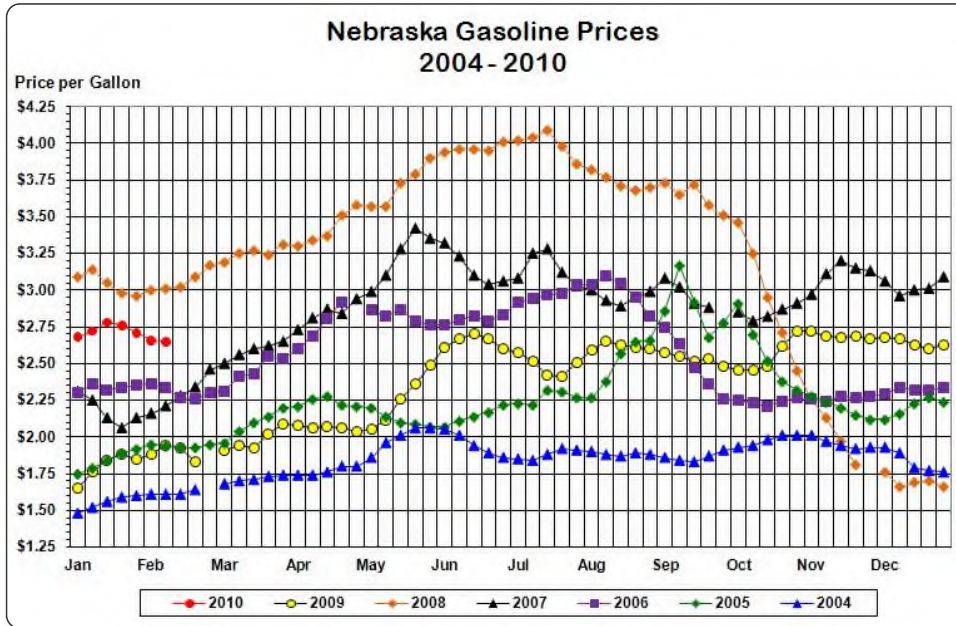
### Notes

Regular unleaded gasoline is regular unleaded motor gasoline with an 87 to 88 octane. Diesel fuel is fuel used for internal combustion in diesel engines. Ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel has sulfur levels of 15 ppm and less while low sulfur diesel fuel ranges from more-than-15 ppm to 500 ppm sulfur.

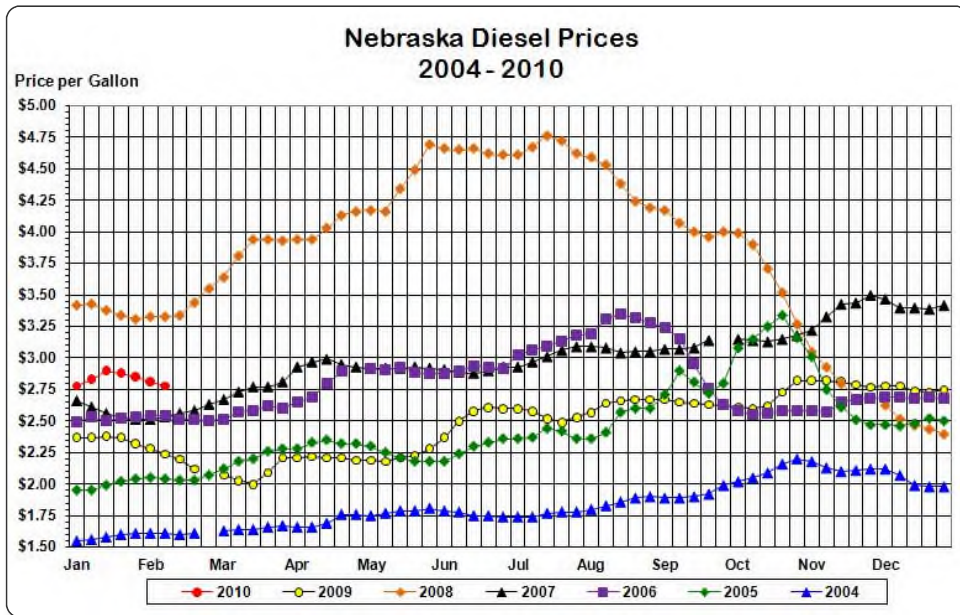
A general rule of thumb: A dollar increase in the [West Texas Intermediate](#) (WTI) crude oil price per barrel will result in a 2.5-cent increase in the gasoline price per gallon and the diesel fuel price per gallon. Likewise, a dollar decrease in the WTI crude oil price per barrel will result in a 2.5-cent decrease in the gasoline price per gallon and the diesel fuel price per gallon.
