Annual Average Electricity Price Comparison by State

Tebraska is the only state that generates electricity entirely by publicly-owned power systems. As of 2016, the statewide average electricity price is the seventeenth-lowest rate in the country, based on the latest federal figures. Nationally, electricity costs 13 percent more than it does in Nebraska. Across all sectors, Hawaii has the highest electricity rate (23.87 cents), and Louisiana has the lowest electricity rate (7.46 cents).
